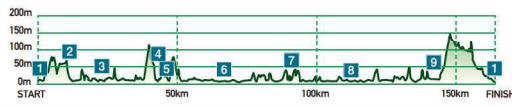
Travel from the outer coast of the Sea of Japan, passing around the Rokkosaki lighthouse on the northern tip of Noto; entering the inner Uchiura, the feeling changes, expressed in the calm and clear sea. It's a route where you can enjoy Noto's Satoyama and Satoumi.

## Sojiji Soin Temple

Founded by Zen master Kaizan Jokin roughly 700 years ago as the head temple of the Soto school of Zen. The Sojiji shopping street stretches out in front of the temple.

The village of the Kitamaebune shipowners, a place where you sense the power of the past.



## START

### 1 Wajima Marine Town

Facilities including the Wajima morning market parking lot, tourist information office and restaurants. In the morning market, seafood and seasonal ingredients are prepared.

### 2 Shiroyone Senmida Rice Terraces

Rice terraces, a representative of the world agricultural heritage that is the Noto Satoyama/Satoumi. The geometric pattern spreading out to the Sea of Japan attracts many visitors.

### 3 Suzu Enden-Mura Roadside Station

The agehama style of salt making, found only in Japan, is introduced here. The entire process from seawater collection to spraying and beyond can be experienced here.

### 4 Kinoura Village

Cottages line the beautiful Kinoura coast, designated as a National Monument Special Zone, with a beautiful view overlooking the Sea of Japan.

### 5 Rokkosaki Lighthouse

Built in the Meiji period, this is still a working lighthouse. Located at the northernmost tip of Noto Peninsula, it's a place where you can see both the sun rising from the sea and then setting at the end of the day.

### 6 Mitsukejima Island

Also known as Gunkanjima (Battleship Island), this is a 28-meter-tall rock formation. The name is said to have come from famous monk Kukai when he came to Noto from Sado.

### 7 Tsukumo Bay (Ikanoei Tsukumall)

There are many attractions in Tsukumo Bay, including sightseeing boats, camping grounds, ocean recreation centers and more.

### 8 Totto-no-Hama Beach

The waves are calm here, with a sandy beach and clear waters. A shower is also available.

### 9 Anamizu Roadside Station

A roadside station attached to Anamizu Station. A full lineup of Noto products are on sale here. The Noto Bar AZ facing the station roundabout is café for cyclists.
